Going to the theatre should elicit a little trepidation. The spectator ought to sense something is about to occur, almost like a trip to the dentist; you know you won't die, but something will have happened, a transaction of sorts, and although you may be confronted, even conflicted of what you think and feel about reality, hopefully in the end we will all come away better for it.




